



LECTURES

Remember - you have to start somewhere!


Teachers are individuals too, and at our university, we're proud to have excellent ones. To build a good relationship with them, it's important to remember the value of mutual respect.

What does this mean?



RA - signifies the main building of the university, located at 2 Sucharskiego Street.

RB - refers to the high school established by UITM. This building is located next to the main UITM building, located at 2 Antony Kopachevskii Street.

KA, KM - offices located within the UITM university campus in Kielnarova.

KE - represents the special medical laboratories situated at the Reh-Mediq rehabilitation center within the Kielnarowa campus.

KD - indicates that you have physical education classes, which are held in one of the largest sports halls in southeastern Poland, located within the Kielnarowa campus.

VIRTUAL UNIVERSITY

This platform serves as the central hub for every UITM student. You can access your schedule, grades (without the need for additional records or grade books), payment information, and curricula here. To log in, use the letter "w" followed by your student ID number (e.g., w12345) as your login, along with your password.

PAYMENTS

On your Virtual University, you can check all necessary payment information: account number, tuition fee etc. Remember that by using our online service, you can get answers to most of your questions related to the university fees.

Timely payment of fees is crucial. Late payments may incur interest charges. Moreover, a student with unpaid tuition fees for 2 out of 5 payments in the current semester or outstanding fees as of March 15th or July 15th of the current year may face exclusion from the list of UITM students.

ELECTRONIC STUDENT ID

Obtaining your ID card comes with several benefits, including transportation discounts, access to university labs, and confirming your attendance at lectures.

To get your ID card, follow these steps:

Confirm your personal information on the VU App under the "PERSONAL DATA" tab. If any details are incorrect, reach out to the Dean's Office for corrections.

Pay a fee of 22 PLN to your individual account through the "BURSAR'S OFFICE > ADDITIONAL INFO" tab on the VU App.

When collecting your ID card at the Dean's Office, make sure to bring the payment confirmation with you.

STUDENT DICTIONARY

To simplify your student life and improve your understanding of the learning process, we've created a dictionary filled with new definitions and explanations for challenging tasks.

A zero-term exam - provides students with an extra opportunity to pass an exam. These exams are optional, and if you do not pass, it will not result in a negative grade being recorded, such as "2.0," at the Dean's Office. Instead, you'll have another chance to improve your preparation for the exam. Zero-term exams are typically offered for some of the most challenging subjects.

Consultations - during the academic year, teachers have consultation hours. If you would like to have come assistance with difficult topics before your exam, you should definitely make use of these hours.

Conditional term - a retake, also known as a conditional term, allows you to make another attempt at passing an exam. During a semester, you can have a maximum of 3 retakes if approved by the Dean. To be eligible for a conditional term, you must attend mandatory paid consultations. These consultations are designed to improve your understanding of the material and provide an opportunity to discuss any challenging questions with the teacher. Information about Conditional term fees can be found on the E-Services platform.

Credit in advance - If you are unable to pass exams during the conditional term (for a maximum of 2 subjects), you have the option to request Credit in advance from the Dean. This allows you to retake the subject in the next semester or even a year later. Information about Credit in advance fees can be found on the E-Services platform.

The individual organisation of studies (IOS) - is a flexible learning option designed to accommodate your specific needs and circumstances. Students can apply for IOS no later than 14 days from the start of the semester. If your application is approved, it may exempt you from mandatory attendance in some classes during the semester. To be eligible for IOS, you must have a valid reason, such as full-time work or an internship. The individual organization of studies is valid for one semester, and information about IOS fees can be found on the E-Services platform. It's important to note that even if you are granted IOS, you are still required to take exams according to the schedule.



STUDENT ETIQUETTE or how to avoid misunderstandings

In your daily interactions with university staff, including teachers, employees of the Dean's Office, and other departments, it's important to maintain a sense of etiquette and professionalism. While our university is modern and dynamic, following these etiquette rules can help make your student life smoother and minimize misunderstandings.

Let's analyze the rules of etiquette using specific examples:

1. If you need to inform your teacher that you are unwell and will be unable to attend today's class, it's essential to use your student email for this communication. This helps maintain a formal and organized channel of communication with your instructors.

REMEMBER the e-mail of every teacher or administrative employee consists of:

first letter of their first name + last name (without Polish characters) + @ + **wsiz.edu.pl** = for example,



When writing an email to your teacher, it's important to follow proper etiquette. Here's a step-by-step guide:

1. Start with a polite address: Begin your email with a respectful salutation, such as "Dear Professor Smith" or "Hello Dr. Johnson."
2. Clear description: Clearly and briefly state the purpose of your email. Whether you have a question, need clarification, or are requesting a consultation, be specific about what you need.
3. Proper ending: Since there are many students at the university, it's important to provide your complete identification at the end of the email. Include your full name, surname, major, or group symbol. This helps the teacher identify you accurately and respond effectively.



2. When seeking in-person consultations:

- Knock before entering: If you need to meet with your teacher in person, always knock on their office door before entering. This shows respect for their privacy and space.
- Greet everyone in a shared office: When entering an office where multiple people work, greet everyone present collectively and in a calm voice, rather than individually. After entering, specify to whom you have come to see.
- Say goodbye when leaving

Keep in mind:

- Dean's Office entrance: There's typically no need to knock when entering the Dean's Office because it often has several stands for different majors or departments.
- Office hours: Be sure to check the indicated opening hours for each department in advance to ensure you visit during the appropriate times.

By following these guidelines, you can maintain a respectful and professional demeanor in your interactions with teachers and university staff.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Globalization promotes the growth of educational migration of young people from all over the world, including Ukraine, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Georgia, Armenia, Moldova, Belarus and other countries. In order to successfully prepare for your arrival and go through the adaptation process in Poland more easily, read the following information.

Before your arrival at UITM

1. List of documents which you have to take the original copies with you:

- High School Education Diploma, including a mark sheet - for undergraduate students;
- Bachelor's diploma and the transcript of records - for master's students;
- Apostille of the mentioned documents;
- Eligibility certificate - for undergraduate students;
- Confirmation of payment (Application fee and tuition);
- English Certificate, which confirms knowledge of a foreign language at least at B2 or higher level in accordance with the Common European Framework;
- Birth certificate.

2. Information for minor (under-age) students

Minor students are required to bring the following documents:

- 1) Notarized permission from the parents (or at least one of the parents) for their child to sign a contract on the provision of educational services and other documents related to education and residence in the Republic of Poland. This document will be attached to the personal file at the university.
- 2) The following forms are signed by the parents (the signature is the full name and surname in Latin):
 - Permission from parents on the form of the Regional Administration (to obtain a temporary residence card).
 - Permission from parents on the form of the National Health Fund (for opening mandatory national student insurance).
 - Parents' signature on the form of the Regional Administration (to obtain a temporary residence card).

Students must translate these documents into Polish upon arrival at the university.

After you arrive at UITM

1. NFZ health insurance

All international students in Poland must have NFZ (National Health Fund) health insurance to access basic medical care and treatment or qualified assistance in case of an accident. The monthly insurance payment is PLN 55.80. Assistance and information on obtaining health insurance are available at the International Student Support Office (room 226).



2. Legalization of stay after the visa expiration

A student can stay on the territory of Poland based on a type D national visa for up to one year. The student can also get a temporary residence permit, which is granted for the whole period of studies (max 3 years). The first permit is issued for a maximum of 15 months. If you need additional help and information on temporary residence card, visit the International Student Support Office (room 226).

3. Procedure for recognition of foreign educational documents (nostrification)

UITM undergraduate students holding High School Education Diplomas from Belarus, Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Georgia, Armenia, and select countries without international treaties must undergo the recognition procedure for their foreign educational documents in Poland. UITM is committed to supporting students through this process. Please note that in case of a failure of nostrification of documents in Poland, students cannot start their studies at UITM. The nostrification of a High School Education Diploma is free.

Required documents:

- High School Education Diploma, including a mark sheet + apostille;
- Special certificate from your school;
- Translation of High School Education Diploma and mark sheet (translated by a notarized translator in Poland);
- Translation of a certificate from school (translated by a notarized translator in Poland).
